### "Building and Regenerating Topsoil" Talk in Mendocino on December 7<sup>th</sup>

Event Description: The historical record shows that the collapses of many past civilizations can be attributed to the depletion of topsoil. Since the beginning of agricultural production in the Great Plains of North America in the 1880s, about one-half of its topsoil has disappeared. Depletion of topsoil can take place through water and wind erosion, overtillage, overuse of nutrient inputs, compaction, pH problems, and salinization. On the average, it takes 500 years to build an inch of top soil, and in many cases in California it takes 2,000 years. A recent UN Report stated that we have only 60 years of topsoil remaining. As human populations continue to increase, and our need for water and soil increase, the preservation, conservation, and restoration of soils has become some of the most important work on Earth. Join us to learn some simple soil-related regenerative techniques for the land you steward, so that you can better care for and rebuild this precious resource.

### Logistics: Thursday, December 7, 2017, 7:00PM to 9:00PM. Held at the Community Center of Mendocino, 998 School Street, Mendocino, CA.

Speaker: Leading this event will be Matt Drewno. Matt runs the Victory Gardens for Peace project, sponsored by Ecology Action of Willits. Situated at the Stanford Inn in Mendocino, the project involves hands-on research into soil regeneration, growing food on poor soils, and changing the composition of soils through natural amendments. The project includes not only an extensive garden, which produces organic food served at Ravens Restaurant (at the Stanford Inn), but also hosts a local seed bank. Matt is certified in permaculture, restoration of oaksavanna ecologies, and biointensive food production. After a Bachelors of Architecture (BA) from Iowa State University, he founded and ran a permaculture design business in the mid-western United States. He has been working with Ecology Action since 2010, serving on the board of directors, and training both individuals and communities in the principles of intensive food production on small plots of land. He

has experience designing and working on organic farm-scale food production, design and implementation of food forests, residential-scale food production, and community gardens.
