Mom's Old Car Helps Save Lives

Two great elements of Westport history left us in June. One was my wife Donna's mom, Darlyne Gunderson, who died peacefully in Donna's arms at the age of 96. Darlyne had lived and visited here in her Westport home (which Donna helped build) for 35 years, and Donna and I have been taking care of Mom here in her home for the past 8 years.

Although Mom couldn't drive it anymore, we still kept her precious 1999 Buick in the garage here for her during the

last 8 years of her life. That car made many trips back and forth from Southern California to Westport in its early years, as Darlyne and her husband Don were enjoying their Westport retirement home. Both Darlyne's and Don's ashes are now interred for the ages in the Westport Cemetery, and it is most fitting that we found a way to put their dear old car to good use for them. The Gunderson Buick was donated to the Westport Volunteer Fire Department as a training vehicle for the new WVFD state-of-the-art car rescue tools – training that enables our first responders to save lives!

The first WVFD training exercise involved deploying their new state-of-the-art-fire suppression grenades that can be used to control a car fire long enough to remove people who might be trapped inside. The second training took place a couple of weeks later

with Cal Fire, using brand new WVFD batteryoperated extrication tools to remove the doors and
posts so the roof could be peeled back, giving full
unobstructed access to any occupants who might be
trapped inside the vehicle. I'm sure that the 20-yearold Buick (pictured above) provided a stern test for
even this modern equipment, as it is built like a tank,
with real steel all the way through. Since older cars
are the most likely to catch fire, the Buick was a good
choice for car fire training as well.

It is so sad to lose Mom, who was our oldest town resident. But she had a very long and happy life, especially here in her beloved home in her beloved Westport. Darlyne was a hospital nurse by trade, serving in that capacity in WWII as well. During her long nursing career, she saved many lives. And now, her trusty old Buick is helping to save lives too!

The Westport Volunteer Fire Department held its annual election for officers and Board members on June 12th. Dan Maxey was elected Fire Chief, John Huff was elected Assistant Fire Chief, and Jeff Mathias, Ski Saunders, and River Saunders were elected Captains. Their one-year terms will begin on July 1st. It has been an honor and a privilege to serve the community of Westport and work with the members of WVFD, three different WVFD Chiefs, and over twenty active members over the last 14 years.

The Garden is open to EVERYONE IN THE WHOLE WORLD 24/7, and is supported by your donation dollars to the Westport Village Society.

All you have to do is get off your rear end and go pick yourself some nice fresh veggies (did I mention it's free?), and you'll be surprised how much better they taste when they're picked fresh like that compared to that days-old stuff you get from the grocery store. Because of our cool-summer Westport climate, what our Community Garden specializes in is salads — and we've got a big variety of salad greens (many of which are hard-to-find in local markets) that any restaurant in the big city would just love to have.

In July at the Westport Community Garden, we'll have butter lettuce, red leaf lettuce, French salad mix, bistro salad mix, arugula, Italian parsley, cilantro, onion chives, French thyme, Greek oregano, lemon balm, green kale, purple kale, Chinese snow peas, and strawberries — with beans, squash, cucumbers, and tomatoes coming in August and September. Stop by the Garden frequently — that way, you can have an ultra-fresh salad every time! Headlands Boat Policy

The Westport Village Society has adopted a new boat policy that is now posted in the Headlands Park and on the Headlands page at: http://www.westportvilla gesociety.org/. Day use of small watercraft is allowed. "Small watercraft" are less than 16 feet and 300 lbs. Larger watercraft are not allowed. You must hand-carry boats from the street. Vehicles are prohibited.

Signs are now posted advising that the ocean poses changeable risks. Boaters should observe safe practices, legal requirements, and exercise reasonable caution. The basic rule is: When in doubt, don't

go out. Overnight storage of small watercraft now requires a permit from the WVS.

Permit applications are available on the Headlands page of the WVS website. They can be submitted to wvs@westportvillagesociety.org. Up to eight permits may be issued per year. A lottery system may be used if the number of applicants exceeds that allotment.

Permits will require that boats are locked to the anchorage established in the middle of the beach when not in use. No boat storage is allowed in the park from November 1 to April 30, and boats should never be secured to the stairs. Please refer to the rules and permit application for additional details. If your boat disappeared from the beach, please contact www.westportvillagesociety.org with an inquiry.
