Last month I mentioned the possibility that the Westport MAC would try to reapply for the second round of ATP transportation funding for a local bike lane project. We applied for the same grant last year, but did not score high enough to be funded. Since the community was interested and several local people ready to help prepare the new grant application, we looked into it.

Unfortunately, after a review of the current grant guidelines and further discussions with staff at the Mendocino Council of Governments, the Westport project does not qualify for the second round grant funding. Come to the WMAC meeting April 2 to learn more about the reasons why.

Remembering Otto Marsh

(Editor's Note: Otto Marsh, owner of The Westport Inn and Deli, passed away on March 4th. He was 88 years old. Fittingly, there was a Green Flash that evening at sunset in Westport.)

We are trying to compile "Memories of Otto" and request everyone send their favorite story or memory of Otto to *The Westport Wave* and also to compile for the family of Otto. His son, Rick and his wife, Jean were at the Deli on the weekend of March 23rd working at the place. Jean was painting the fence and pruning Otto's roses. She commented that she hoped she was doing it right, as she knew how much the roses meant to him, and she was unfamiliar with pruning roses. We talked awhile and she shared that the family wanted to come and share a memorial gathering for Otto and the community. They had several dates in mind and needed to confirm with the rest of the family. Otto's birthday is June 25th and was mentioned. There is a desire to remodel and then reopen the Deli.

I offered to be a liaison person, as did Frank and Lin, (and perhaps others I am unaware of at this time).

Anyone interested in helping can let me or Frank or Lin know and anyone who has had their own contact with the family, perhaps, we can talk with each other and make it easy for the family to communicate with the town. I thought the WVS and the WVFD members were a natural group that would like to put in energy since Otto has graciously let both of our organizations use the Deli for our fundraisers.

There are many in the community that had special relationships with Otto, and I am sure I am unaware of them all, so come forward and share your experiences with Otto, if you would. It would mean a lot to the family to know the special place Otto shared in our community. I know some folks prepared and shared meals with Otto, when he was unable to get out as much. If you have pictures you wish to share, we would like to incorporate them into a memorial folder. It can be of the Deli when it was "the place for breakfast/lunch". Jean, Otto's daughter-in-law said she had pictures of Otto, Rosemary, and Thelma. I asked her if she could share them with us.

Memories of Otto

I remember working for Otto and Thelma at the Deli for a little while - like so many people had back then. I made sandwiches and Otto and I would always kid around with each other - playing tricks on each other and things like that. One time I made him a sandwich and put a piece of saran wrap in between the meat and cheese. I couldn't wait for him to bite into it, and when he did the expression on his face was very straight and he didn't say much – but when I asked him how he liked his sandwich he said, “I'm going to get you back for that!” He always had a hug for me and asked how Steven and Sierra were doing. When we first moved to Westport, we didn't have a phone, so we would go down to Westport and use the pay phone (they usually gave you your money back) and have breakfast at the Deli, like most of Westport did back then. Otto would be pouring coffee along with Thelma – it was a great time. He is sorely missed!

International Space Station Crew Visits Westport

OK, they aren't actually *visiting* Westport, but they'll be flying right over us a bunch of times in April, and in the months ahead as well. And I've asked them all to Wave to us when they do pass over town! The all-star crew of Expedition 43 at the International Space station currently numbers six, including the famous astronaut twin Scott Kelly, who has recently arrived along with cosmonaut Mikhail Kornienko (both will stay on board nearly a year) and the remarkable Space veteran Gennady Padalka. When his mission is over, Commander Kelly will hold the American record for total days in Space by one person, at 522 days. But the real champ is Commander Padalka, who after his 6-month mission will be the all-time world-record holder, with nearly 900 days in Space!

As big as a football field, the International Space Station has in the past 17 years orbited the Earth over 90,000 times, and quite a few of those times it has passed right over California. And yet somehow I never looked for it until recently. When conditions are right, it's so easy to see – at 250 miles up in Space, it looks from here like a bright star, zipping across the

sky in about 5 minutes if it's directly overhead. Two good times coming up to see it here in Westport are **April 4th at 9:02PM** and **April 7th at 7:58PM** – both of these times, the Station will be going in a southwest to northeast direction, and pass almost right overhead. There are a lot of nights that the Station is visible here – and you can keep track of that at <http://www.iss.astroviewer.net/>, which will tell you exactly when the Station is best for viewing. When you do see the Space Station, don't forget to Wave!

“Music”


Music – the woman of my soul;
