The Westport Municipal Advisory Council will meet at 7:00PM on Tuesday, January 5th at the Westport Community Church to consider several issues that have the potential to affect local residents in big ways. The WMAC is a community forum that supplies government agencies with local input. The key topics on the agenda for the upcoming meeting include the County's proposed suspension in June 2016 of a contract for 911 services, LAFCO's approval of an expanded sphere of influence for the Westport Water District, and a pending Coastal Development Permit to protect environmental resources at the Chadbourne Coastal Access. 

WVFD Chief's Report

The Westport Volunteer Fire Department hopes you and your loved ones enjoyed the Holiday Season. We all wish you a Safe and Happy New Year!

2015 was a busy year for WVFD. From January 1st through Christmas Day we responded to 49 calls. These included 4 fires, 24 medical responses (including 10 responses to patients with serious medical emergencies), 2 cliff rescues involving serious injuries, 10 motor vehicle accidents with injuries, and 2 downed power lines. One of our members completed the rigorous Fire Academy course sponsored by Mendocino County Fire Chiefs. Three of our members completed EMT training and passed the National Registry Exam. We acquired a Type 1 fire engine capable of pumping 1,500 gallons a minute and a 2,000-gallon water tanker. All our inservice fire hose has been inspected and pressure tested and it meets National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) and Insurance Services Offices (ISO) standards. Our preparedness plan for the upcoming heavy El Nino rainy season is essentially complete.

During the course of a pretty intense year, we also managed to have fun. The Annual WVFD Barbecue

this past August was the most successful one ever!

WVFD is looking forward to 2016. Plans are underway to equip our Type 1 engine and water tanker with fire hose and fittings so they can be placed in service. We have started work on some initiatives to improve fire safety and awareness in our community. We are very grateful for the ongoing support of our community that makes all of our activities possible.

One additional feature for this year (see photo below) – in December, the WVFD presented Captain Beck Regalia with a brand new custom surfboard in appreciation of Beck's awesome ten years of leadership as Chief of the Fire Department. This gift was made possible

solely by personal donations from Beck's fellow firefighters. Well Done, Beck!
