Based on that input, the WMAC wrote Caltrans to request installation of radar speed advisory signs on Route 1 at both ends of town. Caltrans responded favorably and plans to install those signs early in 2016. 


### Westport Trick-or-Treating and Halloween Potluck

#### Westport Volunteer Fire Department Chief's Report

The Westport Volunteer Fire Department responded to 45 calls during the past twelve months. We work as a team, and typically have several members of the Department responding on each of our calls. I'd like to thank all of our active duty members for serving the community. Our two top responders during past year were Jeff Mathias (39 calls) and Glen Jones (36 calls).

We also have regular training sessions to practice our skills. This month we trained with our new Class 1 engine on a structure fire simulation. Nine firefighters participated in that training on Saturday, September 19<sup>th</sup>. We simultaneously ran two 2-1/2 inch attack lines and also operated the aerial monitor that sits on top of the engine. One of the 2-1/2 inch lines fed two 1-1/2 inch lines, to enable one team to enter a structure with water while the other team applies water to the exterior and stands ready to assist the first team inside the structure. The second 2-1/2 inch line is intended to extinguish the fire from the exterior, while the aerial monitor puts water on the roof.

On Wednesday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>, we conducted an auto extrication exercise at night. The purpose of that exercise was to practice extricating people who are trapped inside a vehicle as the result of a crash or other accident and who may need treatment for injuries.

Ongoing trainings are scheduled for one Saturday and one Wednesday evening a month. If you'd like more information about our activities, feel free to attend one of our business meetings on the second Wednesday of each month starting 6:00PM at the Fire Station. All members of the community are welcome!

### Preparing for El Nino Rains

We've been hearing a lot about a strong El Nino rainy season. While nobody knows exactly what that will mean for our community, we should start preparing now for the possibility of heavy rains starting later this year and continuing into the Spring. From past experience, heavy rains could bring power outages, communication outages, fallen trees, mud and rock slides, downed power lines, and closed roads.

This is the first in a series of articles about what we can do as a community to prepare. Let's start with some things each of us can do:

Have plenty of flashlights with spare batteries

Trim or remove trees that might threaten buildings or power lines in a windstorm

Make sure propane tanks are full before the rains start

Maintain an extra supply of prescription medications (a 60-day supply is recommended)

Have plastic jugs or other empty containers on hand that can be filled with potable water

In case of an emergency during the rainy season, call 911. However, we know from recent experience that

the 911 system can stop working. If that happens, call or text our Fire Chief, Frank Maurice, at (707) 357-1866 or send him an email at

FrankMaurice@sbcglobal.net. If you can't reach Frank, go to the Fire Station. As a last resort, if all else fails and you need help, call Howard Forest Central Dispatch at (707) 459-7403.

The Fire Department and Water District are working together on a plan to have water available at the Fire Station during a major community emergency. WVFD is also working on plans for an emergency basic food supply. We also need to have back up plans for shelter and warmth and restroom facilities for any displaced members of our community.
