There are a variety of matters that may be of interest to you. The WMAC gathers community input on local concerns and advocates for solutions with responsible government agencies.

This month the topics include sanitation issues associated with informal camping on public lands along Highway 1, speeding on Pacific Avenue in Westport, permitting for Medical Marijuana cultivation, and updates on the Westport Transfer Station reopening and Coastal Development Permit 2017-0015 near Kibesillah. The Westport Transfer and Recycling Station Has Re-Opened (Saturdays Only, 9AM to 4PM)

The Westport Municipal Advisory Council to the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors is informing local Westport residents that the Transfer and Recycling Station that was closed earlier this year has re-opened for weekly business on Saturday, July 29th. The Station is located at the same place as before, behind the Westport Volunteer Fire Department Facility. **Business Hours will be on Saturdays only, from 9:00AM to 4:00PM.**

A new, modest \$1.00 per garbage can surcharge will be collected for the Westport County Water District in lieu of site rent. The total fee for dropping waste will be \$7.00 for one 33 gallon can, \$14.00 for two 33 gallon cans, \$21.00 for three 33 gallon cans and \$35.00 for loose refuse per cubic yard. No more than 3 cans will be accepted per visit. Comingled recyclable materials such as mixed paper, cardboard (please breakdown), glass, plastic containers, tin &

aluminum cans will be accepted free of charge. There will, however, be no further credit or cash payouts for recyclable material.

The reopening of the Westport Transfer and Recycling Station was the result of the leadership of the Westport Municipal Advisory Council working with Supervisor Dan Gjerde, the Westport County Water District, and Jerry Ward, President of Solid Waste of Willits. The success of this effort was a good example of local units of government working along with the private sector together to serve the vital needs of a small community. The Westport Municipal Advisory Council appreciates the support in this effort it received from the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors and the Director of the Mendocino County Solid Waste Department.

We may also do some vegetation restoration (cutting invasive ivy stems from trees) and beach and campground clean up. We will have a camp cook, with meals and snacks. Work will be casual enough that visitors to Usal Beach will be welcomed, but focused enough to significantly improve the sometimes inadequate human waste disposal situation.


Leadership Changes at WVFD

On July 12 our Chief, Frank Maurice, took a leave of absence from the Westport Volunteer Fire Department for medical reasons. A member of the WVFD since 2002, Frank has served as Fire Chief since July 1, 2014.

At a Special Meeting of the members that evening, Assistant Chief Dan Maxey was elected Fire Chief and Captain Glen Jones was elected Assistant Chief. Dan, a long-time resident of Westport, joined the Fire Department in 2004 and served as a Captain and Assistant Chief for a number of years. Glen, who earned certification as an EMT and a Firefighter I, is a graduate of the Mendocino County Chiefs’ Firefighter Academy. Beck Regalia and Jeff Mathias will continue to serve as Captains in the Department.

The Westport Volunteer Fire Department provides year-round initial 911 emergency response service for residents and visitors on the Northern Mendocino Coast. Most of our 911 calls involve medical emergencies, cliff and water rescues, motor vehicle accidents and wildland fires. We work on a regular basis with CalFire, the Mendocino Coast District Hospital ambulance service, CalStar and REACH, and are also able to call on Fort Bragg Fire for mutual assistance.



Procrastinators might want to wait until August 12, 2045, when another total solar eclipse will be much closer to Westport.

The Great American Eclipse – For Procrastinators

Ok, folks, unless you've been living under a rock or something, you've probably heard that there's going to be a **Total Solar Eclipse on Monday, August 21st**, right here in the good old USA. This is not "fake news", and it's really going to happen – right when and where our brave scientists tell us it's going to happen. Depending on how exciting your life is (and how much you like solar eclipses), this could be the best two minutes of your life – if you can get to that relatively narrow swath of land from Oregon to South Carolina where the sun will be 100% blocked out (by the moon, in case you weren't clear on that).

And therein lies the problem. Because there's going to be 100 million other people all trying to get to the path of totality at the same time you are! (So you might want to leave a little early.) Never before in human history have so many interstate freeways (and so many people with cars) been combined with a total solar eclipse, so when all is said and done this will likely be called the Traffic Jam Eclipse. But there's nothing like totality, even if it's only 2 minutes of it.

What happens at totality? Well, the sky gets really dark, and the stars come out. Now some cynics out there may point out that this very same thing actually

happens everywhere once every single day, but really a solar eclipse is much better than that. For one thing (if you like crowds), there's a lot more people looking at it all at once. It does get a little tricky, since if it's cloudy where you are the whole thing is going to be a bit of a flop. That just means that more people will be frantically driving to find a place at the last minute where it isn't cloudy.

But what if you haven't made any hotel reservations in just the right place to see the total eclipse, and you don't want to drive to see it anyway? Well, if you just stay in Westport, you'll at least see an 86% eclipse, which is not totally dark but more like about a half-hour-after-sunset

dark – no stars, but you'll be able to see the planet Venus. The difference between this and every other day here is that this "sunset" happens from 9:00AM to 11:30AM (with maximum darkness here at 10:14AM), and you also get to see real neat crescent-shaped shadows. Of course, you're not going to see much if it's foggy here that morning, so you might have to drive to Laytonville or some cloudless place to see anything good. Like I said, leave a little early.

If it seems like there haven't been any really good solar eclipses around here in a long time, you're right – there hasn't been a good one for almost 40 years, which is just the way the schedule has worked out for the USA. But there's going to be a whole bunch of solar eclipses in our country in the 21st Century (see map). If you're really a procrastinator (and aren't too old), there's going to be a real good-er in 2045, with over double the length of totality much closer to home (see map above), so you can always plan on that one if you want a shorter drive. If you want to see what to expect from just about any eclipse anywhere for the next few thousand years, see www.timeanddate.com.

Whichever solar eclipse you choose to view, it goes without saying that you'd better have some special eclipse safety glasses (which are easily available by mail at around 3 for 8 bucks). Otherwise, you'll go blind. But no sense getting anything more expensive, since you'll probably lose them by 2045 anyway.




