COME CELEBRATE THE WESTPORT WHALEFEST On March 23rd!

The 5th Annual Westport Whale Festival will be held this year on Saturday, March 23rd from 11:00AM to 5:00PM on the Westport Headlands! It is sponsored by the nonprofit Westport Village Society and Kyle Siler - owner of the Westport Whale house. The event celebrates the spring migration of Gray Whales from Baja California to Alaska, and scads of fun activities are planned for people of all ages. Come drop in at any time between 11AM and 5PM and join the fun! The event will feature music by Erin and Riley, Miller Family Band, Queer country, and Latchkey, dancing, and skits all day at the main tent; hearty food and drinks; booths offering event merchandise and locally made goods; and diverse activities for children. Kids will love the Treasure Hunt, face painting, coloring templates featuring whales and ocean themes, music and skits, and a bouncy house. Drinks will include grog fit for a leviathan (beer & wine), hot chocolate to warm your bones, and other non-alcoholic beverages. The hearty food will include clam chowder and potato corn chowder catered by the Westport Hotel, as well as assorted baked goods.

Educational talks and whale watching will occur at various times during the day at the Headlands overlook platform. Whale experts will share their knowledge of whale biology and ecology, as well as their enthusiasm for whale conservation.

The physical assets of the property include the Church, the Community Center, and the Community Garden. Most Westport area residents have attended activities at the property and have an idea of how it can contribute to the civic betterment of the Community. The missions of the sponsoring nonprofits both focus on benefiting the community. The WCC mission is to "facilitate opportunities for spiritual growth and serve the needs of the Westport community" while the mission of WVS is in part to "sponsor, organize, and fund civic improvement projects, which are charitable and educational in nature for the broad cultural, educational, and civic betterment of the Village of Westport and its surrounding areas."

The challenge and opportunity is to define *Specific Actions* that will ensure the property is best utilized to support our diverse Community. This meeting offers a forum for the Community to interact and connect to openly discuss how the two nonprofits might collaborate in a way that supports greater Community utilization and support for the facilities.

Town Hall meetings are a tradition older than our country. They started with individuals and small groups meeting, discussing and working together to identify and solve problems, improving their general situation. Town Hall meetings have provided platforms for dialog and feedback, leading to positive change with a sense of ownership among participants. A few discussion points are offered here as a place to begin that dialog:

- What are the challenges involved in operating the facility for the Community's use?
- What activities are desired at the facility by the Community (secular and spiritual)?
- Does the Community want to maintain the facility as-is, or are improvements desirable?
- How will ongoing operation, maintenance, and possible improvements of the property be funded?
- How to move forward and ensure action is taken future meetings & tasks

Sitting here on the banks of the river Ganga in the holy city of Varanasi in India, I can see the fires of the cremation grounds on the other shore.

Life is short. Every day is passing. So often, we go through life spending so much time and energy carrying resentments towards others, towards ourselves, towards the world. How long are we going to hold on to this negativity? We know one day it's all going to end.

Somebody once asked my Guru, "What is the dharma (responsibility) of a human being?" He said in very simple words, "Live in such a way that you find space in another's heart." If we have been able to do that throughout our life, our time on this earth has not been wasted.

There are so many people in our lives - spouses, partners, children, family, friends, co-workers, teachers, students, neighbors, by-standers.
