WVS Hosts Meeting on Headlands Event Policy

The Westport Village Society will host a special in person meeting on Wednesday March 25 at 6:30 pm to review and discuss whether or not to continue to issue permits for events on the Westport Headlands and, if so, what kinds of events and under what terms. The meeting will take place at the Community Center and all are invited to attend.

In the past, both community events such as the annual Westport Volunteer Fire Department BBQ and private events such as weddings have been allowed under the terms of issued permits that stipulate the terms and conditions of those temporary uses. WVS developed a policy to allow uses that do not conflict with our obligation to manage the property for conservation and public access. That obligation is set forth in a Management Plan for the property and in a deed restriction recorded in favor of the State Coastal

Conservancy, the agency that funded the land acquisition.

WVS established a permit process to allow events in the Headlands Park that benefit the community as long as they do not conflict with our conservation and public access mandates. Community benefits have been judged in relation to the WVS mission that includes "To help sponsor, organize and fund civic improvement projects which are charitable and educational in nature for the broad cultural, educational and civic betterment of the Town of Westport and its surrounding areas." Private events never fit that criteria, but WVS felt funds generated by permitting activities like weddings offered a way to support ongoing costs of maintaining the property.

The permitting process and oversight of those allowed events typically requires significant effort by WVS volunteers. WVS currently lacks sufficient volunteers who are knowledgeable about the permit process and willing to donate the time required to manage such events. We welcome your input on this topic.



An afternoon of low hanging clouds and fog couldn't dampen the spirit and enthusiasm of the many artists and attendees of the August 16th, 2025 WVFD Fund Raising BBQ at the Westport Headlands. The March 25th WVS meeting will explore topics surrounding the preservation and maintenance of the property, as well as the volunteer based logistics required to continue the hosting of such events. ## Westport Story

In 1948 in Westport, California a native American and his family lived on the Tar Flat as it was called that and the bluff west of the Westport store.

In the store which had a Bar at the time was an abalone hung above the bar itself measuring 12 plus inches as I remember it.

The Native American who pried it off the rocks was named Vernon "Sharkey" Bowen.

I was a lad of 16 at the time and remember exactly where it was caught...

Directly down from the store and over the 100-foot bank going down to the water's edge was a huge rock that only was accessible on 2 ft minus tides. About 50 feet north of the rock was flat mushroom-like rocks covered with green seaweed.

I remember Sharkey yelling to me while he was standing in knee deep water saying "I found a monster!" and was having a hard time getting it out of the crevice after he pried it off the rock.

Finally, he maneuvered it out of the crevice and both of us were astounded as to the size.

Both of us at the time always took as many Abalone's as we needed and most were all in the 8-inch range in size.

After removing the critter from the shell, Van Dorn asked if he could place it above his bar so everyone could see it, to which Sharkey said yes.

I left Westport in 1950 and as I remember it was over the bar at that time. After the bar closed and the bar area became the post office, I do not know what ever became of the shell.

[I'm] Now 86 and live in the foothills of the Cascade Mountains, Washington State.
