Full Moon Rising

2015 has been a great year for extra-terrestrial exploration, with our continuing focus on a comet (of the Rubber Ducky variety) and two “dwarf planets” (Ceres and Pluto). But in September, there will be some interesting astronomical exploration that we can do right here on our home world. The fun begins with the New Moon on September 13th, which also features a partial solar eclipse (you’ll have to go to South Africa to see it) on the same day that Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year) begins. Then comes our Fall Equinox (at 1:22AM on September 23rd in Westport), which coincides with Yom Kippur. The grand finale (and it’s a big one) is the **Super Full Eclipsed Harvest Blood Moon on Sunday, September 27th**, which coincides with the beginning of Sukkot, or the Feast of Tabernacles.

Let’s hope that the skies are clear in Westport on the evening of September 27th, when the full moon will rise fully eclipsed in the east over our coastal hills just as the sun is setting in the west at a little after 7PM (maximum totality is at 7:47PM). It’s called a “Blood Moon” since the Earth’s shadow typically makes the moon appear reddish, and this moon will look bigger because the moon will be at its closest to Earth. What a great night for a Harvest Moon viewing party!

As you may know by now, this will be the fourth and final Blood Moon in a rare *tetrad* of four in two years that have all coincided with major Jewish holidays (and the only one of the four that will be visible in Israel). There’s a long back-story to this, and it’s an interesting story to know even if (like me) you are not of the apocalyptic sort – see my articles in both the October 2014 and April 2015 issues of *The Westport Wave* (or just google “blood moon”) for more on that.

An Equinox tends to be an eventful time anyway, and it has not escaped me that during the period between the upcoming Fall Equinox and lunar eclipse, Pope Francis will be visiting the USA (including a speech before the General Assembly of the United Nations which will be attended by many of the most powerful leaders on our planet), with a mission to encourage global peace, unity, and environmental stewardship. Exciting times to be sure, both as we look to the sky and also as we look around at our Earth!
